The Governing Body - Constitution and Terms of Reference 2018 - 2019

Membership

The governing body shall consist of 13 governors including the head teacher comprising the following:

- 2 parent governors
- 1 local authority governor
- 1 headteacher
- 1 staff governor
- 2 partnership governors
- 6 co-opted (full governors)

The fully constituted governing body may co-opt whomsoever it wishes as 'Associate Governors' in order to fulfil its duties effectively and efficiently.

The Chair may not be an employee of the school

Quorum

The quorum shall be one half the membership of the full governing board at any given time (rounded up to a whole number).

Terms of Reference

Biddenham International School and Sports College Governing Body will take a strategic role to oversee the management of the school and will act as a critical friend by providing challenge and support. The Governing Body will be accountable for its decisions, as a Maintained School to Bedford Borough Council.

It will set the aims and objectives of the school and agree the School Development plan. It will monitor and review policies, targets and priorities. In fulfilling its role, it will:

- agree constitutional matters, including procedures where the governing body has discretion. This includes the size and make-up of the Governing body set out in the Instrument of Government. It will therefore carry out a regular audit of the skills and competences of the governors, to ensure that it can carry out its responsibilities. It will recruit new members as vacancies arise and appoint new governors where appropriate. The governing body will ensure that there is training available for governors to develop and improve their skills and knowledge. The governing body can suspend a governor.
- Hold at least four governing body meetings a year. There will usually be two governing body meetings in the autumn term, and one in each of the subsequent terms. Additional meetings will be called as required. In order to go ahead, there needs to be a quorum of governors. The quorum is half the number of governors on the governing body. Papers will be sent out by e mail at least one week in advance of the meeting.

- Appoint the chair and vice chair or confirm in post, if the governing body has agreed to a longer term than one year for each position. This will happen at the first governing body meeting of the new academic year. The governing body also can remove the chair or vice chair if necessary. The governing body is also responsible for appointing or removing the clerk to the governors. The governing body will ensure that all governors have access to training, and that the clerk has training to enable him/her to advise the governing body appropriately.

- Will establish the committees of the governing body. The committees are finance, resources and site; curriculum; strategy; pay; ad hoc committees, such as appointment, disciplinary and appeal committees. It will agree terms of reference with each committee, setting out which functions will be delegated to those committees. It will receive the minutes of each committee meeting identifying decisions made and with a summary of any recommendations from the committee meeting to be considered by the governing body. These arrangements will be reviewed on an annual basis. It is anticipated that each lay member of the governing body will be a member of one committee. It is also anticipated that governors will come into school at least once a year to follow up a line of enquiry, and have access to senior staff, staff, and students. This will be reported in brief to the governing body, using a template devised for the purpose.

- Agree the first formal budget plan of the financial year and receive termly updates from the finance manager.

- receive an annual report on Safeguarding; it will monitor the review of all policies in accordance with an agreed calendar carried out by the committees.


- Governors will be involved in the appointment of senior members of staff. They will be responsible for appraising the head teacher and the Executive Principal - Partnerships,

1. The name of the school is **Biddenham International School and Sports College**.
2. The school is a Foundation school without a Foundation.
3. The name of the governing board is “**The Governing Board of Biddenham International School and Sports College**”.
4. The governing board shall consist of:
 - a) 2 parent governors
 - b) 1 Local Authority governor
 - c) 1 head teacher
 - d) 1 staff governor
 - e) 2 partnership governors
 - f) 6 co-opted governors
5. The total number of governors is 13.
6. This Instrument of Government comes into effect on 4th December 2017.
8. This Instrument of Government was made by order of Bedford Borough Council, as Local Authority on 4th December 2017.
9. A copy of the Instrument must be supplied to every member of the governing board.
