Key risks:

- Spread of Covid-19.
- Someone becomes unwell with Covid-19 symptoms.
- There is a confirmed case of coronavirus.
- Staffing: The school is in danger of closing because of low staffing levels.
- Resources: Resources are running low so the school is at risk of closing.
- Cleaning: Stocks/staffing are dangerously low putting school at risk of closure.
- Health and Safety: Staff, parents, unions deem the health and safety measures in place inadequate resulting in low staffing or student attendance levels.
- Site constraints: adaptations to make the site safe within Covid-19 guidelines are physically or financially prohibitive.

- Adaptations to staff-student ratios and associated risks are prohibitive and dangerous.
- Workload: staff workload in terms of emergency curriculum planning and adaptation is prohibitive in terms of time and practicality.

Parents/carers will be asked to telephone reception when they are in the car park, and students will follow the one way system out and leave the site to their awaiting car. Students will need to undertake a Covid19 test and inform the school of the result, before returning to school.</p> <p>Staff becoming unwell during the day, should go straight to their car, or to the isolation room A9 and telephone the cover phone to inform us that they are leaving the site and isolating, until tested for Covid19. If used, A9 will be cleaned carefully, following contamination guidance.</p> <p>The Sanctuary should not be used for students who are suspected of or exhibiting Covid 19 symptoms and these will be clarified with all staff and students . Only students who have medical needs or require medical or counselling appointments will have access to The Sanctuary. and therefore will need to maintain a high standard of cleanliness and alertness. Staff should email/phone Caroline Gray or Kirsty Nice and wait for a reply before sending students out. 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		<p>with an IR thermometer and 999 will be called if they are seriously ill or injured or their life is at risk.</p> <p>In the case of a symptomatic student who needs to be supervised before being picked up in A9:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">● If a distance of 2m can't be maintained, supervising staff will wear a fluid-resistant surgical mask and be outside the door unless symptomatic and help is required.● If contact is necessary, supervising staff will also wear disposable gloves and a disposable apron● If there's a risk of splashing to the eyes, such as from coughing, spitting or vomiting, supervising staff will also wear a visor● PPE will be disposed of properly, following decontamination guidance <p>Supervising staff will wash their hands thoroughly for 20 seconds after the pupil has been picked up.</p> <p>If parental pick up is not available the student will be sent home in a taxi. Discussions will be held with the providers to ensure that one of the following steps will be taken:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">● Use of a vehicle with a bulkhead (i.e. the driver is in a separate compartment to any passengers); or● The driver and passenger will maintain a distance of 2m from each other; or● The driver will use PPE (the same PPE as when supervising a symptomatic student, as explained above) and the passenger will wear a face mask <p>A deep clean will take place in the areas that the symptomatic person has been in, and PPE will be disposed of properly, following decontamination guidance.</p>	DB/On call staff		
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		<p>We will ask students to take 2 lateral flow tests per week at home.</p> <p>In all cases:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> We will carefully read the government guidance on administering tests and ask the individuals to read the instructions given with the test kit carefully / explain to them (as appropriate) to make sure everyone knows how to safely administer tests. <p>We won't need to see evidence of a negative test result in order to allow staff and pupils to attend school.</p> <p>All staff and students will continue to follow the measures set out in this risk assessment, even if we are participating in rapid testing.</p> <p>We will ask students and staff to share positive test results with us, and we will keep accurate records of these results. 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<p>Contact with coronavirus when getting to and from school</p>		<p>Everyone will be encouraged to walk or cycle into school, and asked to avoid taking public transport during peak times if possible. We have adequate bike storage and do not use any dedicated school buses.</p> <p>Anyone who needs to take public transport will be referred to government guidance.</p> <p>Parents/carers who need to drop off and pick up students will be told through messages and signage:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students should arrive just prior to start times and leave the site immediately after the end of the school session or wait in their car if waiting for sibling/s with a different finish time. • Students should arrive at school individually and not in groups. 		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Only one parent/carer should drop off and pick up and should remain in their vehicles at all times. • Not to gather at entrance gates, car parks or doors, or enter the site unless they have a pre-arranged appointment • We recommend that staff should not car share if they are not from the same household. <p>Masks/face coverings:</p> <p>We strongly recommend that students and staff bring masks to school to wear in corridors, more confined spaces and in close contact situations, such as queuing for food. Also, if in a class situation where a member of staff requests the wearing of a mask, this could be for health reasons or protecting a vulnerable family member. The same goes for students who may wish to continue to wear masks for similar reasons.</p> <p>Government guidance around 'how to wear a face covering' will be followed.</p> <p>A supply of spare face masks will be kept for anyone who arrives without one or has a covering that is unsafe to wear.</p>			
<p>Spreading infection due to touch, sneezes and coughs</p>		<p>Handwashing facilities will be provided in all blocks, and hand sanitising gel will be available in classrooms, the main hall, sports hall, dance studio, drama studio, meeting rooms, dining areas, reception and offices.</p> <p>Hand sanitising stations will be located at the entrance to every block.</p> <p>Everyone in school will:</p>	<p>HH</p>	<p>September 2021</p>	

- Wash their hands with soap and water for 20 seconds and dry thoroughly if they have easy access to a washroom using [NHS guidelines](#), but more likely they will use alcohol-based hand sanitiser to cover all parts of their hands. Students will be allowed to bring in their own.
- Clean their hands on arrival, after breaks, if they change rooms, before and after eating, and after sneezing or coughing
- Be encouraged not to touch their mouth, eyes and nose
- Use a tissue or elbow to cough or sneeze, and use bins for tissue waste

Pupils will be encouraged to learn and practise these habits in lessons and morning briefings and by posters put up across the school.

Tutor time has been moved to the start of the day to enable tutors to ensure students are well, fit for school, have washed/sanitised their hands and are following the new systems. This will allow us to teach students the new school routines, conduct welfare checks and set the tone for the day, every day.

There will be a focus initially on wellbeing, hygiene and health starting school in September after such a long time out of the classroom.

Supplies for soap, hand sanitiser and disposable paper towels and tissues will be topped up regularly and monitored to make sure they're not close to running out.

Bins for tissues will be located by hand sanitising stations and will be emptied throughout the day. Lidded bins will be provided for higher risk areas eg. isolation room

<p>Spreading infection through contact with coronavirus on surfaces</p>		<p>Cleaning staff will regularly clean frequently touched surfaces using standard cleaning products (e.g. bleach, detergent), including:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Banisters ● Bathroom facilities (including taps and flush buttons) ● Door and window handles ● Furniture ● Light switches ● Reception desks <p>All groups need to limit the amount they touch all of the above where possible. External and internal doors need to be open at all times. students and staff will be reminded of this in safety briefings.</p> <p>Pupils and parents/carers will be asked to limit the amount of equipment they bring into school each day to essentials like bags, lunch boxes, hats, coats, books, stationary, chromebook and mobile phones.</p> <p>Areas of the school that are used by staff and students will be cleaned thoroughly at the end of the day.</p> <p>Departmental risk assessments will be updated in line with current legislation</p> <p>Antibacterial wipes, spray and blue paper rolls will be available for cleaning. Gloves will be available in classrooms and teaching areas.</p> <p>If a person with coronavirus symptoms comes into school, a deep clean will take place in the areas that the person has been in, following decontamination guidance.</p> <p>Cleaning supplies will be topped up regularly and monitored to make sure they're not close to running out.</p>	<p>HH / Ridgecrest / Site team</p>	<p>1st September 2021</p>

Doors will be open, where fire safety and safeguarding wouldn't be compromised.</p> <p>The use of the lift to the library will be avoided unless essential as now and a click and collect service will operate.</p>

Individuals vulnerable to serious infection coming into school		<p>The government is no longer instructing people to work from home if they can, so the school will continue to follow statutory health and safety requirements, conduct a risk assessment, and take reasonable steps to manage risks in their workplace or setting, as set out in this guidance.</p> <p>For pregnant staff who are 28 weeks pregnant and beyond, or are pregnant and have an underlying health condition that puts them at a greater risk of severe illness from COVID-19 at any gestation, should take a more precautionary approach.</p> <p>The school will follow the government guidance for pregnant employees. We will carry out a risk assessment and remove or manage identified risks where possible.
