PROGRESS COMMENT

This is used to identify whether a student is 'Exceeding', 'On Track' or 'Off Track' and a reason why.

- **Exceeding** = Current grade is above where it should be from starting point in the year
- **ON Track** = Current threshold is within one sub grade of where they should be from starting point in the year
- **Below Track** = Current threshold is more than two sub grades below where should be from starting point in the year

EFFORT

- Excellent, Good, Satisfactory or Poor
- If your child has received is poor or satisfactory you should be aware of this through communication through Classcharts or contact with the class teacher.

CURRENT GRADE

This is the threshold that the student has achieved in relation to the National Curriculum criteria for the year. The criteria for Year 8 increases in difficulty to that for Year 7.

- **This is a cumulative grade** from all assessment points in the year **not** just the most recent test paper.
- Your child should be familiar with this and reminded that this grade takes into account all the content they should know by the end of the academic year
- In order for you child to receive secure or mastered they must be showing independence in the understanding of skills an knowledge in the subject area in relation to the whole academic year content.
