

1. What is happening in the scene?

Mrs Johnstone works for Mrs Lyons, as a housekeeper. Mrs Lyons finds out Mrs Johnstone is having twins. Mrs Lyons persuades her to give one of the twins after birth, as Mrs Johnstone is in a dilemma as to how she will cope. Mrs Lyons is not in a position to have children of her own and is prepared to offer one of the twins a good life. When the twins are born, Mrs. Lyons takes Edward, and Mickey stays with his biological mother.


- 2. What does your costume design tell the audience about the character? The costume design for Mrs Lyons, illustrates that she is wealthy and lives a comfortable life. Mrs Lyons is from a middle class family and wears the latest fashion trends. This suggests that she will dress in fancy, posh outfits made with luxurious fabric and expensive accessories.
- 3. What precise details have you included that communicate these ideas to the audience? (You must pick out elements of your design the explains what they say about the character) The details I have included in the design of the costume shows the character is wealthy, as the fabric/materials of the costume is made of silk. This presents the character as living an affluent lifestyle, as silk is an expensive fabric to buy and wear. The dress is embellished with gold buttons, which also emphasises wealth and luxury. Gold is a symbol of success and achievement, therefore, this will be portrayed to the audience. The costume in itself is indicative of the lifestyle the character is depicted as and allows the audience to understand the role of Mrs Lyons in the play.

1. What is happening in the scene?

Mickey looks up to his older brother, Sammy, and plays games on the street with his neighbours. Mrs Johnstone said to Mickey not to play near the big houses. Mickey then went and sat on a bench, where he saw Edward and they started talking to each other. They became friends quickly and had found out they had the same birthday. They become "blood brothers". When Mickey and Edward were playing together, Mickey's mother realised who the other boy was and she told Edward not to play with Mickey.

- 2. What does your costume design tell the audience about the character? The costume design for Edward, illustrates that he is a school boy and lives a comfortable life. Edward will wear a high-quality uniform made from cashmere fabric and expensive accessories. This suggests Edward is from a middle class family and dresses in luxurious, well-kept clothes.
- 3. What precise details have you included that communicate these ideas to the audience? (You must pick out elements of your design the explains what they say about the character) The details I have included in the design of the costume shows the character is posh, as the fabric/materials of the costume is made of cashmere. This presents the character as living a pleasant and well-off life, as cashmere is an expensive fabric to buy and wear. The shirt is decorated with bold luxurious buttons, which also emphasises that his clothes are made by well-known designers. The shoes are smart, fresh and clean. This displays that Edward's family does not struggle financially by the way he is dressed in his school uniform. It also symbolises he is from a wealthy family, therefore, this will be portrayed to the audience. Edward's costume indicates the way the character's lifestyle is depicted as and allows the audience to understand the role of Edward in the play.
