How will I be assessed?

GCSE Spanish has a Foundation Tier (grades 1–5) and a Higher Tier (grades 4–9). Students must take all four question papers at the same tier.

There are 4 areas of assessment:

- Paper 1 Listening exam (25% of GCSE).
- Paper 2 Speaking Non-exam assessment (25% of GCSE).
- Paper 3 Reading exam (25% of GCSE).
- Paper 4 Writing exam (25% of GCSE).
